



Location: Heritage Park in Alpine (where we've met before)



Information:

Since I mentioned this drive at the last monthly meeting, I've had to change my original plan for September's monthly meeting for a number of reasons. **First**, there is an issue with traffic on the Alpine loop on any Saturday, and with fall leaf changes traffic will be even worse. This can make the drive actually dangerous and hair raising, especially the last half. **Second**, finding a restaurant than can seat about 45 has proven too difficult. **Third**, The Sundance full moon lift event will be most crowded on Saturday night.

For these reasons our meeting and drive will be on Thursday night, September 8th at 6pm. I know this is an unusual idea, but that might increase the appeal as something new can be a shot in the arm.



The plan is to meet at the park in Alpine for our meeting. As the event does not open until 8:30 the 6pm time should work. Bring your own food and maybe chairs as always, and then we'll have our meeting and visit. After the meeting (7pm or so) I will lead the drive east to Alpine then through a much less crowded Alpine loop to Sundance. After the lift ride, we'll continue down and out the Provo canyon side and each heads home.

Tickets can be purchased in advance and price is \$30 or \$25 for seniors for the Sundance lift. I know this is a work night, but I don't think it will run that late. If people want they could just attend the park and meeting, or do a partial drive, or do the whole drive to Sundance but skip the lift event. Here is the ticket link to the event, hope it works:


Flaming Gorge / Dinosaur NP Report By: Valerie Francis

Just like the Flaming Gorge trip, a group of seven Miatas met up to have a fun driving adventure. The theme for this trip however was "can we outrun the rain clouds"? See below to read how we did.

We headed out of Kamas and up over Wolf Creek Pass where the temperatures dropped as well as a few raindrops going over the top of Wolf Creek. We did pull over to put up our tops but mostly because the clouds looked so ominous. Only a short while later the sporadic rain stopped and the sun intermittently popped out. After a quick stop in Duchesne, we headed down Hwy 191. The traffic was light and we only caught up with a slower vehicle just a few miles from the turn onto Hwy 6.



At Helper, we walked through the Arts Festival and mini car show, and enjoyed a food truck lunch. The festival is small and quaint with a variety of arts and crafts to look at and purchase, and a really good variety of cars to peruse. One couple left from the Festival to go home, and the rest of us headed on down the road to our next adventure... Nine Mile Canyon National Backcountry Byway.



The weather nicely cooperated at the Festival especially since rain was forecasted, but by the time we reached Wellington and the start of Nine Mile Canyon Byway some very dark clouds were starting to build up. So we decided to drive to the end first and then stop at the various petroglyph stops on the way back out.

Here is a little background for those who have not been to Nine Mile Canyon: Starting at the turn off in Wellington the road is actually 46 miles long so a 92 mile round trip. Part of this road is signed at 55 mph but once you reach the designated "Nine Mile Canyon" the signage is posted at 35 mph. Additionally, there are about 15 to 20 each 10 mph

posted dips where potential flash flooding runs across the road.

So we were faced with dark rainclouds building while traversing these flash flood dips, some with mud in them already from previous storms, just hoping we would make it in and out okay. We reached the last petroglyph site without any rain, enjoyed the amazing petroglyphs, then headed back to stop at a few more on the way out. But it was not to be as the clouds opened up and it started pouring rain! Luckily, as the lead car, Doyle and I saw the rain ahead so we all stopped to put our tops up before it hit us. At that point, we wisely choose not to make any other stops but to save them for a future trip into the canyon when it is sunny.



Because of the

heavy rain now and the thought of getting stranded by flash floods pouring through those dips, we bee-lined it out of the canyon as quickly as we could (Doyle scaring some of the following cars because of how fast he was driving). And of course, by the time we made it out of the canyon area, it had turned sunny again. We were all grateful to make it safely out of the canyon, and to the hotel to relax a bit, then have a nice dinner together.

The next morning, several Miatas headed straight home via Hwy 6, while a couple of Miatas headed south to Huntington, up

over Huntington Canyon and then down Fairview Canyon (a recon for the upcoming Bryce Capitol Reef adventure

later in September).



In the end, we were not able to outrun the rain but we did outrun any flash flooding, especially in reading how this same storm flooded downtown Moab and Canyonlands!

Wow, this fun adventure is coming up quick, so below are the details on the first day's itinerary, including our initial meet-up time and place.

Since we know who has reserved a room at Ruby's Inn (as of August 12th) I will be sending a separate email in the near future to those members going, with all the details for this three day drive. Please contact me if you are going but possibly staying elsewhere or reserved a room at Ruby's Inn after August 12th.

Friday Sept 23: SLC to Bryce via Nephi, Salina, Gooseberry Road and Fish Lake

- 1. 9:00 AM Meet at Harmons Bangerter 125 E 13800 S, Draper.
- **2. 9:15 AM** Head out to Nephi. Bio-break at Nephi Phillips 66 or Chevron (815 E 100 N, Nephi).
- 3. From Nephi to Salina via Hwy 132, merging with Hwy 89 south of Moroni. Your choice: Lunch at Mom's Café (10 E Main Street) or Salina City Park (go south on 300 East until you reach the park).
- 4. After lunch regroup at Maverick Gas station next to I-70 interchange (260 E Industrial Park Drive)
- 5. After topping off gas at Maverick, we head east on I-70 to exit 63, then follow Gooseberry Road to Fish Lake on Hwy 25. Bio-break at Fish Lake.
- 6. Fish Lake to Bryce NP via short jog north on Hwy 24 turning at Hwy 62 south through Koosharem, then continue south till we reach Hwy 22 through Antimony to Bryce.
- 7. After checking into Ruby's Inn, dinner at (Time TBD) at Ruby's Cowboy Buffet and Steak Room, or dinner on your own. Explore the park that evening at your leisure.

This is a 5 hr 13 min drive day before stops and breaks. Again, the following days' itineraries will be emailed to those going.




