Here are five reasons why the Miata club promotes health through sunlight and friendship

1. Boosts Vitamin D through Sunlight Exposure

Driving a convertible Miata with the top down offers a perfect opportunity to soak in natural sunlight. Sunlight exposure helps the body produce **vitamin D**, which is essential for strong bones, a healthy immune system, and improved mood. Many people are deficient in vitamin D, especially in colder or indoor-heavy climates. Regular drives with the Miata club provide safe and enjoyable ways to increase sunlight exposure while doing something you love.

2. Reduces Stress through Outdoor Experiences

Time outdoors has been scientifically linked to lower cortisol levels (the stress hormone). Miata club members often take scenic drives through mountains, valleys, or coastlines, creating a calm and peaceful environment. These natural settings combined with fresh air and sunshine help reduce anxiety and promote relaxation. Being surrounded by nature—even while cruising at 50 mph—provides therapeutic benefits that indoor or city living can't always offer.

3. Friendship is one of the most important factors in long-term health. Belonging to a Miata club means regularly engaging with like-minded people who share a passion for fun, cars, and freedom. Club meets, drives, and events foster **camaraderie**, laughter, and shared memories. This sense of belonging helps reduce feelings of isolation and improves mental health—especially for people who may otherwise lack a strong social network.

4. Encourages Physical Activity and Engagement

While driving itself isn't exactly exercise, Miata club events often include activities like scenic hikes, photo stops, or walk-around car shows. These events get people moving, standing, walking, and interacting. More importantly, they encourage an **active lifestyle**—getting members out of the house and into new environments, which stimulates both the mind and body.





New Club Member Application & Waiver by Mike Bailey Notice of Membership Dues Increase in 2026 Updated Club Website

The UMC has a revised Membership Application and Liability Waiver that officers and directors have been working on as the previous application was revised back in 2017. We also have a more legal, formal Liability Waiver to replace the one I wrote way back in the early days of the club. This has been discussed at several past Board meetings. The new Application and Waiver will be posted on the club's Website and I will be posting it on the club Facebook page.

The Club's Website has been updated by our Webmaster, Doyle Sturm. It is still a work in process as we are updating information on all the pages making it current. If you have not checked it out recently check it out here: www.utahmiataclub.org.

To keep up with many of the expenses of running the club the officers and directors have decided to increase the Membership Dues of members. This will take place and voted on at the December Holiday dinner party on December 13, 2025. The increase is very small from \$25.00 for a Single Membership to \$30.00. The Dual Membership for a couple will be \$40.00 which is currently at \$35.00. This is only raising it \$5.00. The membership cost has been the same for the past 20+ years! This is a minimal increase considering inflation and what things cost currently.

I have a report on the cost of club dues that I found in my collection of old club Newsletters. Back in *January 2003* dues were \$30.00. Hello Everybody -That was 23 years ago! Back then dues were for a *single or dual membership*. Also back then we mailed out the newsletter at a cost of \$1.05 each month for an 8-page newsletter. We didn't have or use email back then. *In 2008 dues were \$25.00 and if the NL was mailed it was \$30.00. From 2010-2020 Dues were \$25.00 and \$30 respectively if mailed NL and if you paid by PayPal it added \$2.00 or \$27.00 for dues.* You see, our costs have been low all these years. I know other clubs charge their members more! I have samples of many of these old newsletters which I will bring to future meetings in case anyone wants to look through them.

We have a new Venmo account set up for paying dues. If you want to pay by Venmo use: username@UMCTreas for your payment. Details for Dues payments is still on page 3 of the newsletter at top of the page.

On another note we discussed in a quarterly board meeting in the Fall of 2023 and the club came up with the idea recognizing "Lifetime Members" those members who have been members for 20 consecutive years or more and made a gesture for them to not pay any annual club dues. We did that for awhile and then in December 2023 we posted in an article in that newsletter and the club decided to still recognize lifetime members by issuing them a "Lifetime Anniversary Pin" for their continued membership in the club. The club still needs all members to pay their dues because of the continuing expenses the club incurs. The club survives and exists because of members paying their annual dues. Below is a blurb in the December 2023 newsletter concerning this change:

1.) In the meeting it was ratified by a majority vote of club members attending that we "End the dues-free memberships" previously given to Lifetime Members (members who have been in the club continuously for 20 years). We will and do, however, plan to continue to recognize lifetime members by issuing them a 'Lifetime Anniversary Pin' for their continued membership in the club.

We will continue to give notice in the monthly newsletters of members whose dues are 'Expiring Soon' and 'Expired' and hopefully they will pay their membership by their annual membership date or they will be taken off the club roster. Member benefits including receiving the monthly newsletter and participating on the club's Facebook page. Please support the club by paying your dues! We have discussed that some of our Out of State members who don't enjoy all of our club benefits will still be members in good standing.

One Last Canyon Before the Snow Flies (And a Pumpkin Patch)

Date: Saturday, October 11th **Time:** 11:30 AM

Where: Wadman Park, North Ogden. Bring your lunch and camp chairs.

Address: 2700 North 1050 East, North Ogden. From I-15, take Exit 349 (2700 North) and head

straight east.

Details: The meeting will be held at Wadman Park while we enjoy lunch. Bring your own lunch from home or there are several fast-food places on 2700 North right after you exit I-15 East. Bring your camp chairs (in case the pavilion is not available).

Drive Details: After the meeting, we will drive up over North Ogden Canyon Road and down towards Eden. At the 4 way stop in Eden, we will see what our Miatas are capable of as we drive up Powder Mountain Road. "With an average grade of 14% over 5 miles" we will be having fun testing our engine torque on the way up and our brakes on the way down!



After leaving the canyon, we will head towards Huntsville and end the drive at the Historic Monastery Farm by McFarland Family Farms where there is a U-Pick Pumpkin Patch and Fall Festival. At the festival there is an artisan market, food trucks and fresh produce, etc.

Drive time from Wadman Park to Pumpkin Patch (not including any stops) is approximately 1 hr 15 min / 39 miles.

Then on your own, there are several ways home including driving down Ogden Canyon by skirting the south (or even north) side of Pineview Res-

ervoir, or driving over Trappers Loop into Mountain Green. From Mountain Green, head home via Weber Canyon, Morgan & East Canyon, etc.

But wait, there's more: If you go over Trappers Loop, you can go to the Snowbasin Oktoberfest: Cost is \$10 per person, open until 6:00 pm, "This traditional German-inspired beer festival is where visitors can enjoy Bavarian food, live music, a local market, and fun activities. It also showcases local Utah breweries, offering a variety of craft beer."

pated as this was a fun day and drive!






























July Idaho / Montana Trip Report by Mike Bailey
