

These two wonderful people are almost a "Fairy Tale" couple and have known each other for most of their lives.. from the time they were young children. You can certainly tell that they enjoy each other's company and have made some wonderful friends along the way to share their time and adventures with. I also especially enjoy Kathy's daily words of wisdom on Facebook and her positive outlook on life.

Kathy will tell you more about themselves in the following article;

Our vanity plate reflects a rearview perspective of what our two sons dubbed their white-haired parents as we motor down the road.



We met in the 4th grade and were engaged our senior year of high school. Our wedding photo was taken just after we said our "I do's." We had no car, so we borrowed a car (1962 Corvair) for our two days Honeymoon and \$50, which covered the cost of gas, meals and two overnights. (No credit cards back then.) Gary had just completed his first semester at Indiana State University and I had graduated from Indiana Business College two days before our wedding. No jobs and no car and too young to know better!



Our very first car in 1964 was a mixed blessing -- a year old 1963 British-made Triumph TR3B roadster with a four-cylinder engine and a four-speed transmission. It was red with a white top, side curtains, tonneau cover, racing stripes, and a detachable hardtop. We loved it but our parents thought it to be a somewhat homely design and none too practical for a struggling college student and an underemployed spouse.



Although our two sons have been the delight of our lives, when the last one left for college, we traded in the station wagon for a two-seater -- our first Miata (1995). Over the subsequent years we have owned a 1990, two 1995s, 2000, 2007(Indiana car), 2010, and 2015 (Florida car).

In 1967 we lived a year in Greeley, CO. As retirement approached in 2013 we wanted to spend some time roaming the Rockies but were unsure about how to proceed. We had previously noted UMC's annual gatherings at Moab. While scanning club activities on the web, we discovered a multiple day trip called the

Great Western Adventure. I boldly sent an e-mail to the trip organizer, a fellow by the name of Lou Vredeveld, and asked if the UMC would consider new members from out of state? In Lou's kind response he inquired why would folks from Indiana be interested in joining the Utah Miata Club? I replied because we wanted to travel with them on the Great Western Adventure. He said send in your \$20 for the membership and he would send me the GWA details ... and so began our history with UMC!

We live in the Indianapolis area, which is our excuse for not attending monthly club meetings; we became new members of the Utah Miata Club in 2013 in anticipation of joining in the launch of the Great Western Adventure. The next challenge was the three days trip from Indianapolis to Salt Lake City. For our initial GWA meeting we met strangers for breakfast and Lou was the first to greet us. We left breakfast with a welcoming group of lifetime friends from Utah.

The eager travelers in 12 Miatas from the Utah Miata Club had already made overnight reservations at previously designated hotels along the route. GWA was indeed a "great" trip of driving the Miata friendly roads from Salt Lake City to the San Juan Islands in Washington down the Oregon coast through the majestic Redwood Forest and back to club headquarters.

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In early summer we left Indiana on June 25, 2014 and traveled to Moab, Utah where we spent three days roaming its unique combination of beautiful red rock scenery and arches along with the cool waters of the Colorado River. From Moab we traveled to the Bryce Canyon gathering of 125 Miatas hosted by the Utah Miata Club during July 2 – 5, 2014. We were awe-struck by the raw beauty of colorfully displayed cathedral-like hoodoos as far as the eye could see.

On July 8, 2014 we stored our Miata in Gordy's barn at Salt Lake City after the Bryce Canyon event and flew back home to Indiana as a welcomed alternative to driving through Kansas. We then flew back over Kansas to Salt Lake City on September 8, 2014 for the 8 days tour dubbed the Great South West Adventure, which included "standin' on the corner at Winslow, Arizona" and took us across four states (Utah, New Mexico, Arizona, and Colorado).

Although the road trips with UMC are by far our favorite gatherings, we have attended such national Miata events at Cleveland, Pocono Mountains, Atlanta, Dallas, Daytona and more recent gatherings at Charleston (SC), St. Louis, Pennsylvania, Nashville, Johnson City (TN), the Ozarks, and San Diego. In 2008 the two of us co-chaired an Indy Gathering of 150 cars at the Indianapolis 500 Motor Speedway. In September 2019 we were pleased to reunite with our UMC friends in their Mustangs at the Fall for New England II gathering in Massachusetts.



Over our years together we both have completed over 40 years in our respective careers of real estate and special education administration. Including our home state of Indiana, we have lived in four states (Colorado, Florida, Illinois). We recently celebrated our 57th wedding anniversary on December 29 (1963 – 2020). We are now spending 6 months in our Indiana condo and 6 months in our Florida villa and drive our golf cart to play pickleball 3 to 5 days weekly.



Both of our boys graduated from Ball State University (where David Letterman is the most noted alum). One son, Graig, is a detective and married to Krista, a nurse, and parents of our two grandchildren, Camden and Cylar. Dayne, our second son, also enjoys a career in real estate and lives in the Indianapolis area with his wife, Beth, an insurance company representative.

We have been down roads less traveled in the lower 48 states primarily with members of the Miata Clubs of Utah, Windy City, and Indy. Over the years, we

have met many people along the way who came into our lives for a certain Reason, a Season and a few for our Lifetime. We were influenced by them all. Rocky Mountain Road Trip: July 31st - August 7th By: Roger Heath



The Rocky Mountain Road Trip is still on for late summer 2021. For those going or contemplating on going, hotels are filling up or nearly full. The trip begins in the Harmons parking lot in Roy, UT on July 31st. Driving the backroads through Logan and Soda Springs we spend the first night in Jackson, WY. After an early morning start we drive north into Yellowstone NP, around Yellowstone Lake on our way to Cody, WY. Just after passing Cody we jump on the Chief Joseph Scenic Byway then turn on to the Beartooth Hwy finally ending up in Red Lodge, MT. Day 3 is a casual drive to Great Falls, MT, the only time we'll be on the interstate. Aug 3rd finds us leaving Great Falls and heading towards Glacier NP. We enter the park on the east side and drive over the Going-to-the-Sun Road. Those driving are at a disadvantage as you really need to pay attention to traffic and drop-offs. We exit the park on the west side and head to Bigfork, MT along Flathead Lake for the night. Leaving Montana, we head south along Flat Head Lake and into Idaho for the 4th night in Salmon. On the morning of Aug 5th we leave Idaho and head back into Montana on our way to West Yellowstone. Before we get to West Yellowstone we drive through two Ghost Towns, Virginia City and Nevada City. Virginia City would be a great place to stop and do a little site seeing. West Yellowstone will be the final stop for some, others we'll spend the day in Yellowstone NP and the final night in Jackson again.

Teton NP (only if we drive through on the way to Red Lodge, MT) \$35.00, Yellowstone NP \$35.00, Glacier NP \$35.00. Or use the America the Beautiful Annual Pass \$80.00. Or for Veterans and Gold Star families entrance is free with your ID card

I am not sure how many of you know of, or have seen a Vanderhall Roadster. **Vanderhall Motor Works** is an American vehicle manufacturer based in Provo, Utah. They manufacture hand-made three-wheeled autocycles designed for sports driving, touring, commuting and city driving. Vanderhall was established in 2010, and the idea of the vehicles the founders had envisioned took five years to design before ever releasing a prototype to the public. They have several models of this roadster.

I have been in touch with the company to arrange a tour of their facilities in Utah County, and they agreed to let us come to see their production facilities for Free, but only if we would be willing to submit a Google review after the tour. I agreed that we would be willing to do this. This tour will be similar to the one we have done twice before in past years at Kirkham's Motor Sports, also located in Provo. We will get an up-close look at the vehicles and how they are made. It should be a lot of fun for 'car enthusiasts' as we claim to be.

I mentioned this at the January meeting and there was an overwhelming positive response to do this tour, so I will be making arrangements for our group to attend within the next couple months. I want to create a list of who would like to participate on coming on this tour. We will then select a date to go. This will be a private tour just for our group as they usually do not solicit general group tours. This tour would require us to be somewhat socially distanced, wear our masks, and we must abide by health dept guidelines. Vanderhall makes several different models which range in price from \$25,950. to \$35,950. They also have a Navarro ATV vehicle in the works.

This year, we would like it to be very simple, and something for members to enjoy while we are still going through the Coronavirus pandemic.

We have come up with a couple of options on the "Theme" for this event. I have been working with the Texas Lone Star Miata Club for several years in a row now, with their 'Texas Miata Challenge' in making the logo for their event and printing up T-Shirts and Event Pins for the participants. The goodies help with the participation factor in members joining in as they wanted to get a fun T-Shirt for it. For example, the Texas club's event theme this past year was "Ghosts & Legends" where they drove the entire state of Texas to Ghost towns and had to take a photo of each place in a different town along with the town's sign. Attached are the logos I did for their shirts and pins. Another year it was hamburger joints derived from an official list of the 'Best burgers in Texas'. Another year it was historical locations.
