




BEARTOOTH HIGHWAY TRIP—GROUP AT GRAND TETON MOUNTAINS

September 9th Monthly Meeting and Bear Lake Drive

The annual favorite Bear Lake Raspberry Shake Drive is finally here.



Bring your camp chairs in case the pavilion is occupied, and if you like, a breakfast or snack to eat in the park while we have the

meeting. Hoping to be on the road by 11:00 am.

Route: It's a long 2-hour 40-minute drive from the park to Bear Lake - plus an additional 2 hours or more home, not including stops, so we need to get an early start. From the park we will travel north on Hwy 89 to Weber Canyon, then up over Trappers Loop past Huntsville and on to Monte Cristo Hwy. Then on to Woodruff and Randolph, ending in Garden City at Bear Lake. We will decide bathroom breaks as we go, which may be in Hunstville City Park, or Woodruff Country Store, or Randolph City Park... or a campground along the way.

Different this year: Due to sometimes feeling rushed in the past when we reach Bear Lake, the drive will officially end at Garden City. Everyone can stay however long they want to enjoy a raspberry shake, have lunch, spend some time on the beach, or even drive around the whole lake. Note: There have been some notices online that UDOT will be installing fiber optic cables in Logan Canyon throughout this fall, starting at both ends (for cell service towers and additional traffic cameras). "Construction will mostly be limited to the shoulder of the road, but that likely means lane closures depending on the area". Hopefully since we will be traveling on a Saturday there won't be any active construction going on. In any case, drive home safely.

Total drive time from Farmington back to Bountiful is 4-hrs 44 minutes, plus stops, and 234 miles.








We displayed that nutcracker at all our annual Miata Christmas parties at our home for years!

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October 7, 2023 - Monthly Meeting & Drive: Lava Hot Springs, Idaho

During the July picnic and annual meeting, the club outlined dates and drives through the end of 2023. We volunteered to lead the October drive, and proposed that the club travel to Lava Hot Springs, ID. We enjoy our visits to Lava, and hope that everyone will like it as much as we do.



The drive and the day are on the long side of normal for a Saturday event, which means an earlier than customary start. But, the day will be broken into sections, so that there is enough relaxation to keep it thoroughly enjoyable. Here are the plans as they stand...

Meetup time: The monthly business meeting will come to order at 8:30AM (so we can be on the road by 9:30AM). Location: The covered picnic area, **George Wahlen Park**, 4200 S 2175 W, Roy, UT 84067. There is an east entrance to the park, off 1900 W, which does not go through. You want the west entrance off 2175 W. (41.187663 N, 112.032099 W). After September 30th there is no reserved seating, so bring camp chairs just in case. We have met in that park before, so you might recall that there are restrooms nearby. However, given the time of year, it's likely they will be locked.

To shorten the trip just a smidge, and avoid the challenges of keeping the group together through city traffic, we will make a short dash up I-15 to the Brigham City/Logan exit. We will transit Sardine Canyon, skirt Logan itself, and take US 91 to Preston. It's a short hop to where we will turn east on SR 36 to Montpelier. This section of the trip is over a beautiful, winding mountain road. Then it's US 30 the rest of the way to Lava.

We will enjoy lunch at the 78 Main Street Eatery, followed by a relaxing soak in the famous hot pools of Lava Hot Springs. Entrance is \$10 for seniors (60+), \$12 for adults. Bring a swimsuit, towel and flip flops or swim shoes. There are private changing stalls. Clothing and personal effects may be kept in coin-op lockers while you relax. Once fingers are well-pruned and you are fully recovered—ready to tackle the trip home—it would be a mistake to skip town without a stop at the Sweet Stuff Ice Cream Parlor on Main Street, for excellent Farr's ice cream.

The ice cream stop is the official end of the activity. Some might want to head west out of Lava and catch I-15 for the quickest return. Finding a motel nearby might be your cuppa joe. We plan to drive east, then south on SR 34 back through Preston, Logan, Sardine Canyon and home. This section of the drive will be recognizable to those who went on the Beartooth trip.

Roy to Lava via Montpelier is 175 miles and 3:15. En route, Logan, Preston or Montpelier are possible rest stops. The return to Roy (to choose a theoretical end point) by way of SR 34 to Preston, Logan, etc. is 136 miles and 2:15. Total drive time is 5:30, with a relaxing break in the middle. You will need to add your distance from the Wahlen Park in Roy to calculate your miles and time. There is no shortage of gas stations along the journey. But, what do you think? Can you make the 311 mile circuit without refueling?

Announcing a Replication of the First Utah Miata Club T-Shirt!

The art work to the right is the recreation of the art work for the original and first Tee Shirt for the Utah Miata Club in 1991. It features the Miata Club of America, which was the first Miata Club created in the country for Miatas. This club was based out of Southern California and featured the Miata *Club of America Logo* on it. The Miata Club of America was run by Barbara Beach and others individuals tied closely to Mazda North American Corporation (MNAO). They also had a monthly magazine of which Bob Retzer was the main photographer, whom I bought my 2002 Blazing Yellow from. Various Miata clubs that cropped up at the time used this logo as part of their own club logo, including ours!



The **Utah Miata Club** was the "**UTAH CHAPTER**" of the Miata Club of America! I used to have a shirt like this when I first joined the club, and wanted to put it on the Quilt that Lynn made for me out of some of my collection of Miata shirts, but I couldn't find the shirt when she was doing that. These shirts can be ordered now for \$20.00 each. They should be printed on an Ash Grey or any light colored shirts.
