# From the Top Down by Mike Thompson

Here are several auto industry trends I read recently at www.exploding topics.com. You get my comments for free.

- 1. Electric vehicle adoption is growing worldwide If you want an EV, go for it. They have much to offer. But their market share is growing very slowly. "EV sales grew from less than 1% of total vehicle sales a decade ago to more than 4% today." Surely the rate will increase. But it's oversold as a trend.
- 2. Autonomous vehicles are coming There are 1,400 self-driving vehicles on the road today, projected to grow to 33 million by 2040. That's still just 10% of the total. The vast majority of those surveyed indicate that they prefer to drive rather than be driven by the car.
- 3. Cars will become even more connected to the internet Given that the biggest investments are being made by Google and Apple, we might wonder if connectivity has more to do with following your travels than anything else.
- 4. Vehicle purchases are shifting to online Even before Covid-19, 43% of car buyers said they wished they could complete the entire car-buying process online. I don't much care for going to a dealership to buy, so I am all over this one.
- 5. A worldwide shortage of semiconductor chips hurts all the trends And just about everything else you buy.
- The inventory of cars for sale remains low, pushing prices upward That's Econ 101. "With low inventory comes high prices. In fact, car prices are the highest they've ever been."
- 7. Hydrogen may be the fuel of the future This is truly interesting: electric cars, but no batteries, no plugging into the grid. A fuel cell generates the electricity in a chemical reaction of hydrogen and oxygen. The only byproduct is water. Refueling looks a lot like pumping gas, and takes about 5 minutes. This is a technology that could really make a difference.

During August we traveled the Nebo Loop. The drive started with a visit and lunch at the Shri Shri Krishna Temple in Spanish Fork, and ended in Saratoga Springs. It was hot! 

Dragon" which is a very twisty road 11 miles long but has 318 curves. It takes some
















Miata Club in Texas went there this year and I have some

Our good friends and long time UMC Members Donn and Janet Cichocki live in Goffstown, New Hampshire. We have been good friends for almost 20 years since we met at our Miatas in Moab II event in 2005. Donn has been quite ill this past year and close to dying after having some 20+ surgeries and also complications from Covid after our Hawaiian Miata cruise this past December. His experiences have been much like my own. Blood clots in his legs and other infections, Afib heart problems, bleeding on his brain and vascular issues and infections. He was in ICU for weeks after passing out at his home. Janet thought he was dead! They nicked an artery in his heart and he almost died. Please remember him in your prayers. We met Donn and Janet in 2005 at Miatas in Moab when he stopped to help me out as I had a flat tire on my 1995 Merlot NA. No spare as my trunk was full of Miata shirts to sell at the event! We've been good friends all these years now. For many years they flew out to Utah and borrowed our 2002 Blazing Yellow to go to our Miatas in Utah and other Western US events and we flew to New Hampshire and used their 2nd Miata to attend East coast events. We've been on more world wide Miata cruises with them than I can count! They planned and took many UMC members in 2019 around all the East Coast states for Fall for New England and we all had so much fun. We will be visiting them in October for a week. 
#### Cons:


