Location: West Bountiful City Park



Address: 550 W 1600 N, West Bountiful, UT 84087

Access the park by driving south from Centerville on 400 West or driving north from Bountiful on 200 West (which are the same road) then go west under the freeway on 1600 N (Pages Lane) Bountiful.

Information: The park bowery can't be reserved until April 15th so it is first come first serve. So **bring your camp chairs or a blanket** in case the bowery is being used.

Bring your own lunch: there are many fast food places along Bountiful 5th S. (Exit 316) and even more at the Centerville Parrish Lane exit (Exit 319). There are no fast food places at the Bountiful 400 N. exit. Please bring your masks as we will continue to social distance.

Drive Information: Weather permitting, after lunch we will head north to Huntsville via Legacy Hwy, to Hwy 89, then Weber Canyon, and up over Trappers Loop. We will stop for a break at the Huntsville Town Park. After our break we then head through Eden and up over North Ogden Canyon. This is the official end of the drive and you can choose your own route home. The drive leader will be going back south via N Mountain Road which eventually turns into Harrison Blvd, then back down Hwy 89 to I-15 or Legacy. Or you can head west on 2700 N, Ogden, directly to I-15.

It was January of 2007 and all our family did our annual car show get together at Southtown Expo Center. A few minutes in, my son Tyler ran over and said "I just found the car you are going to buy, Dad". Yeah right I thought as he led me to a 2008 copper red new power retractable hard-top MX-5. It didn't take much to convince me, and Tyler and I set up a test drive in a soft top within a week (no PRHTs in yet). With Tyler on my side we convinced Ronda to agree and it was ordered for August delivery. Taking delivery we were told of the Utah Miata Club and I almost lied on the application as it sounded strange to us. A few days later a friendly guy named Mike Bailey called me at work and invited me to a drive-in movie with the club. Ronda did not bite, but Tyler said "If I can drive, I'll go with you". In front of the screen was a line of Miata's with great people, and the rest is history.

Our first trip was to Torrey in September of 2007. Arriving in Torrey around 3 pm, everyone gathered to chat outside the motel rooms, Ronda and I thought more driving sounded fun. We ended up driving through Capitol Reef and to Hite marina, then back. We loved it. Ronda was in.


We hope that all of you that have had a long 2020 know that you are all in our thoughts and we look forward to "Miata nerding" with you again soon!

You can see by the attached pictures of the itinerary how organized the Puget Sound Miata Club was. As it turned out the leader was a race driver but was temperate to us vacationing Sunday drivers.

From Kalispell we went north up to "going to the sun highway" in Glacier National Park. With many stops we finally headed out of Glacier NP at Mary's Lake and then headed for Great Falls, Montana.

After spending the night at Great Falls we took off for West Yellowstone at a speed somewhat faster than the speed limit. I was really proud of Jan when she said enough is enough and **slowed** to 80mph. When we stopped for a break several of the cars behind thanked her for comfort zoning.

Stuff you need to know

Bear Country Jamboree

- Start each day with a full gas tank. Several of our drives are long enough to be a problem if your tank isn't full.
- Run with parking lights on.
- On long driving legs, your tour leaders may be listening to the stereo, not the CB. If you need to contact us, turn your headlights on. If the car behind you turns on their lights, turn your lights on to pass the signal forward. The leader will then turn the stereo down and the CB up so you can talk.
- When stopping for an animal jam, **DO NOT SET YOUR CAR ALARM!** The "whoop-whoop" will spook the animals.

Helpful Hints for Drives

Now that we are getting back into top-down driving weather, here is a reminder of how to help make our drives enjoyable and safe. And we are always looking for volunteers to lead a drive!

Drive Leaders:

- Have a drivers meeting before starting the drive and review:
 - ⇒ The route, general directions, and stops along the route
 - ⇒ Remind everyone to turn on FRS radios and channel used (usually 5.5)
 - ⇒ If someone does not have a radio, place them towards the front of the group.
 - ⇒ Invite/select a sweep car
- When planning the route incorporate right hand turns instead left hand turns whenever possible.
- If possible, pre-test your drive for timing and road conditions. (Can also use Google Maps to calculate drive times and road conditions.)
- When planning the route (or during the drive) look for safe areas to regroup in case the group gets separated.
- If you need to pull over to regroup make sure the pull off area will accommodate the entire group.
- When reentering the road from a pull out, wait for Sweep to confirm that it is safe to pull out.
- For longer drives, plan a pit stop about every 1 to 1 ½ hours, especially during the first leg of the drive.
- Alternately, via radio, call out upcoming pit stop areas and request feedback if anyone needs to stop.
- Call out items that may impact the group; rocks in the road, or cattle, bicyclists and people on the edge of the road, etc.



Drive Sweep:

- Inform the Drive Leader if the group gets separated.
- If the group has pulled over to regroup, inform the leader/everyone when it is clear for the entire group to pull back onto the road.
- The Sweep car pulls out first when pulling back onto the road, with everyone else pulling out at the same time.

All drive Participants:

- Arrive with a full tank of gas especially for longer drives.
- Bring a FRS radio.
- Listen for directions, warnings, possible stops.
- Notify Drive Leader if you are leaving the drive early.
- Pull out as a group when the Sweep confirms it is safe to pull out from a regrouping stop.
- Utilize double left hand turn lanes to help ensue all cars get through a green left hand turn light, then merge back into a single lane.
