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### From the Top Down “Oh, the Places We’ll Go!” By: Valerie Francis, President

Summer is now in full bloom and so far we have had the opportunity to not only go on several drives, enjoying some twisty roads and local sites, but to also connect with our fellow Miata friends.

Speaking of great drives, did you know that there are over 2,200 miles of Scenic Byways winding through Utah? And because of these designated Byways, we can relish the beautiful scenery and interesting sites up close from our Miatas. Did you also know that Utah actually started The Scenic Byway program? Back in the mid-1980’s, tourism organizations in Utah brainstormed on how to lure back some of the travelers and tourists taken away by the interstate highway system. The Utah Scenic Byways program was the result of this brainstorming. Then in 1991 the National Scenic Byway Program was established. These roads receive their distinction because of their archaeological, historical, natural, recreational, and scenic attributes. But as we all know, they also provide some of the best twisty road driving experiences for us!

Currently there are twenty roads designated as State Scenic Byways. Eight more have been designated as National Scenic Byways. And one of those eight, **Scenic Byway 12** from Panguitch through Escalante to Torrey, carries a unique honor as Utah’s only **All-American Road**.

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The eight National Scenic Byways include: **Dinosaur Diamond National Scenic Byway** - in eastern Utah and western Colorado, and includes Dinosaur National Monument, the Utah Fieldhouse of Natural History, The College of Eastern Utah Prehistoric Museum, Fruita, Moab, and Cleveland-Lloyd Dinosaur Quarry. **Patchwork Parkway National Scenic Byway** - from Parowan to Panguitch taking you past Brian Head and Cedar Breaks National Monument. **Energy Loop** - from Huntington to Fairview & Eccles Canyons past Scofield State Park. **Flaming Gorge-Uintas National Scenic Byway** - from Vernal north to Manila at the Wyoming border. **Scenic Byway 12 - Utah's All-American Road** goes through Red Canyon, Bryce Canyon National Park, Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument and over Boulder Mountain. **Logan Canyon National Scenic Byway** - from Logan to Garden City at Bear Lake. **Nebo Loop National Scenic Byway** - Crosses the Uinta National Forest between Nephi and Payson, past the 11,928 foot Mount Nebo. **Trail of the Ancients National Scenic Byway** - winding through the ancient Puebloan (or Anasazi) country of southeastern Utah via Blanding, Bluff, and Mexican Hat.

How many of these wonderful National Scenic Byways have you driven? Next month, I will talk about the State Scenic Byways. Off the top of your head, how many can you list? These Scenic Byways literally pave the way to the best Miata driving, sights, and scenery in the state. Oh the places we have to go Zoom Zooming!





## August Monthly "Breakfast" Information


