
ARCHES NATIONAL PARK DRIVE – MIATAS IN MOAB VI

This is a Self-Guided Drive: Due to the popularity of Arches National Park, it is suggested to visit early morning or early evening to avoid traffic congestion.





- 1. From Red Cliffs Lodge, turn right onto SR 128 for approximately 14.5 miles (towards Moab)
- 2. At US 191 junction turn right onto US 191 for approximately 2 miles
- 3. Turn right on the Arches National Park entrance road
- 4. Pay the Park Entrance Fee (\$10 fee per vehicle / good for 7 days, or use a Senior Pass

5. Turn right into Visitors Center parking lot for optional Visitor Center visit. This is highly suggested to learn about areas in the park.

- 6. Leaving the Visitors Center turn right to continue into the park on Arches Scenic Drive
- 7. Refer to park map and stop at various pull-outs to enjoy the views

8. Suggest stopping at right hand pull-outs and taking side roads "The Windows Road" and "Delicate Arch Road" on the way in, and left hand pull-outs on the way out.

9. Refer to park map for walking trails to several arches.

- 10. Return to Red Cliffs Lodge
- 11. Depending on number of stop and walks, allow 3 4 Hours for this drive

About Arches National Park:

Arches National Park preserves over 2,000 natural sandstone arches, like Double Arch (above), the worldfamous Delicate Arch, as well as many other unusual rock formations. In some areas, the forces of nature have exposed millions of years of geologic history. The extraordinary features of the park create a landscape of contrasting colors, landforms and textures that is unlike any other in the world. The forces of nature have acted in concert to create the landscape of Arches, which contains the greatest density of natural arches in the world. Throughout the park, rock layers reveal millions of years of deposition, erosion and other geologic events.
