

**Time: 11:30 am.** We will meet in the private dining room. After our regular club meeting we will line up for a drive to a location determined by next month. Drive led by the Baileys.
















2024 Colorado Peak to Peak Miata Club Event by Steve Beckstead Trip will be from Sunday, September 15 – Friday, September 20, 2024

The always enjoyable annual Bear Lake Raspberry Shake Drive is happening – but this year we are going on a weekday to hopefully avoid some of the crowds at Bear Lake/Garden City. We understand some of our Mi-

ata Club friends are not retired yet, so we are hoping some of you might be able to take a vacation day and join us. Here are the plans for the day:

Because this is not our normal monthly meeting and is a long day's drive, we will start mid-morning, arriving in Garden City around lunchtime.

Meetup time and location: **Thursday, 8/22,10:00** am at the Weber Canyon I-84 Eastbound Rest Area, address: I-84 milepost 91 (just before the Mountain Green exit). From our meetup location, it is just over 2 hours to reach Garden City at Bear Lake plus an additional 2 hours or more home, not including stops, so we need to get an early start.

Route: From the rest area meetup we will drive past Mountain Green, travel up over Trappers Loop skirting Huntsville and on to Monte Cristo Hwy. Then on to Woodruff and Randolph, ending in Garden City at Bear Lake. Bathroom breaks are possibly at Monte Cristo Campground and/or Randolph.

**The same as last year:** the drive will officially end at Garden City. Everyone can stay however long they want to enjoy a raspberry shake, have lunch, spend some time on the beach, or even drive around the whole lake. Each can then make their own way back home over Logan Canyon and Sardine Canyon, back through Evanston, or back over Monte Cristo/Trappers Loop.

Last year there were a variety of ways we all went home: A few did circumvent the lake, a few took Logan Canyon, but the winners in enjoying the most drive time were the Bagley's and Wood's. With them, we backtracked over Monte Cristo and Trappers Loop where Doyle and I left to go down Weber Canyon. 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## How to Plan and Lead a Club Drive by Mike Bailey

It's not hard to lead a club drive. There are only a few things you need to be sure to get done. This is sort of a comprehensive plan but it covers most all things to be aware of. The hardest part is coming up with an idea about what or where would be fun for other drivers to go and do. The rest is easy! To plan and lead a club drive, you have to do the following:

Come up with an idea.
Plan the route
Contact any restaurants or other stop locations to be sure they can handle the number of people for a breakfast or lunch.
Test Drive the route.
Announce the trip.
Lead the drive.
I will explain how I handle each of these in the paragraphs below. Come Up with an Idea: There are basically two factors that can lead to a good drive; a fun place to go, or a fun way to get there. If you can come with both, all the better! You want to pick a place that is not much more than two hours away, or 4-5 hours round trip. For overnighters, people expect to drive a good distance, but for a day drive, people want to get it done and get home by mid- late afternoon. We like to keep overnight drives to moderate mileage per day as not to get too tired and worn out with all the driving.

**Plan the Route:** When I start working on a new drive, I always start with maps. I always pick a starting place at or near a large gas station where people can top off their tanks (and pick up a drink/get rid of the last drink) that is towards the destination. On most local Utah drives we usually pick a park or parking lot to meet at. Or a restau-



rant if we have a meal first. If we plan to have the meal later, we just head out toward the destination with planned stops along the way for rest room breaks or to get gas, however you <u>ALWAYS want to have your gas tank full before beginning the</u> <u>drive.</u> Also check to see if everything in or on your Miata is working properly. Check tire pressure, washer fluid, and don't forget to bring your **FRS Radios for communication**!

Next, I open Google Maps and start to look for interesting looking roads between where I want to start and where I want to go. It's fine to go out of the way to make sure you hit an interesting section of road. The goal is to make the drive interesting, not to get there via the shortest or fastest route. A good route may go past something interesting (like an unusual building or artwork), something pretty (like a lake, river, or garden), or it may have some winding or tree lined country roads. Avoid dirt or gravel roads. We usually try to avoid freeways or interstates and try to keep on secondary roads, highways with scenic views or drives. Some



freeway driving is expected to get to the secondary roads you want to take. The more twists and turns the better!



You need to keep in mind when setting up the route that there will be a tail of cars behind you, so you need to try to avoid intersections that are difficult to cross. If you really need to go through a tough traffic area, plan for where you and a bunch of other cars can pull over and wait for people to catch up. If you are going to stop at a restaurant or something, be sure talk to the place and be sure that they will be able to handle the expected size of the crowd. Plan places to stop for a rest. Many people need a break at least every hour or so to stretch the legs, potty stops, and other things. Plan to take 20 minutes or so at each break when planning how long the run will take. Try to find places with enough capacity to handle the crowd in a short time. <u>Test Drive the Route:</u> Look for construction problems or other things that may become an issue.



## How to Plan and Lead a Drive (Continued from previous page)

You have to drive the route at least once, and twice does not hurt (at least for short or day drives). You want to be sure that there are no problems along the way. Sometimes what looks good on the map turns out not so good in person! Also, you want to familiarize yourself with the turns. If you test drive well before the run, then it is a good idea to test drive it again a day or two before the run to be sure no construction has cropped up along the way. A critical point of test driving the route is that you need to determine the distance between each point in your driving directions. During the test drive, hopefully you have someone with you to do the writing, set your mileage odometer and make note of how far it is to each turn, city or stop from the last one. I like to put both the distance for just the current leg of the trip and the cumulative distance on my driving directions.

Announce the Trip: You have to pick a day at least a couple of weeks in advance so people will have time to plan, preferably a month out. If planned in advance, submit to the newsletter editor and/or post information on our club Facebook page to everyone. Sometimes on a day long or multiple days drive you will need to print driving directions for each car signed up and a few extra for those that decide to come at the last minute. Make sure that the directions have the address of the start location and also major stops along the way so people can put them into GPS systems in case they get lost.



Lead the Drive: Some people find this the most daunting part of leading a run, but I like it. There are several points to keep in mind when leading the drive: • Have enough copies of the directions. • If you are stopping at an establishment, make sure you call them the morning of the run with final numbers and a day or two ahead to remind them you are coming. • Start reasonably on time but if the starting point is difficult to get to, give people a couple of minutes extra to get through traffic, etc. Try to keep track of who has said they were coming so you can estimate if everyone has showed up at the meeting point. • You need a Sweep (some clubs call it a 'Sweeper' (person to drive at the end to keep track that people are not lost and that obstacles are past) For large groups (15 -20 or more cars) it is a good idea to have a Relay person in the middle of the run to relay radio messages between the Leader and the Sweep.



• Have your FRS radio to communicate with drivers & passengers. We use Channel 5.5. • During the drive the Leader and Sweep will need to keep in touch about when obstacles are past, so a little chatter on the radio is fun for everyone, but give them a chance when just passing difficult intersections. The Sweep will announce when they are though the intersection, or if they get stopped at a light or something, they will announce how many cars are stuck and will update when they are free again. The Leader will announce major turns or direction changes so everyone will know where the turns are in case someone lost sight of the car in front of them for a moment. When I'm Sweep I like to repeat these turn notifications so the Leader knows that their announcement was heard by everyone. • Don't drive as fast as you normally might. Keep an eye behind you so you don't leave people, and keep in mind that the longer the line behind you, the more people will get strung out and need to catch up. Give them a chance to do so without risking a ticket! • If people are having trouble getting through a congested intersection or are strung out too far, find a place where the group can safely pull over and wait for people to catch up. • Most drives will not return to where they start, so be sure everyone knows how to get back from where you end up. Most times we just return home on our own, but on overnighters, we also plan the drive home. It's a good idea to also bring cell phones so a member can call someone if they get lost or have an emergency! We'd like members to come forward and help plan or lead a drive. Once you do it, it will be easier the next time. You can also volunteer to be a Sweep or the Mid-Driver relay lookout.



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


