**For the elections**, we will be nominating and voting for the positions of President, Vice President, and two Directors. Jim and Margie Newson have already verbally agreed to be nominated as Secretary and Treasurer, so we will formalize their positions at the meeting.

During the election portion of the meeting the President will accept nominations of members from the floor for the positions noted above and contingent upon the nominee's acceptance. If you cannot attend the meeting you can cast a vote in the election of officers by submitting a signed ballot to the President prior to the meeting.

## Roles and Responsibilities as listed on the Utahmiataclub.org website: President -

Chief responsibility is Public Relations with Miata related sponsors and groups. Conducting monthly meetings and overseeing them. Making arrangements with restaurants for monthly club luncheon. Communicating with other club Officers to make sure they are on top of their assigned duties. Helping other officers if need be. Duty to write "From the Top Down" article for newsletter. Additionally, from the club Bylaws: Conducting Executive Board meetings as needed but at least once per calendar quarter.

#### Vice President / Event Coordinator-

Chief responsibility is to handle Public Relations on Club events. Coordinate, help members with, and plan club drives, activities and events. Help President conduct club meetings and help other officers be on top of their assigned duties.

## December Holiday Party Food (Slow Cooker Creamed Corn) By: Valerie Francis

Speaking of the Holiday party, I think we all agree that the food was delicious! Several members requested Sharon's corn recipe (which I made for Christmas Eve dinner) so here it is:

#### Ingredients:

3 (15.25 ounces) cans whole kernel corn, drained

- 1 cup milk
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 8 ounces cream cheese, cubed
- 1/2 cup (1 stick) unsalted butter, cut into thin slices

#### **Directions:**

- 1. Place corn in slow cooker. Stir in milk, sugar, and pepper until well combined. Without stirring, top with butter and cream cheese. Cover and cook on high heat for 2—3 hours.
- 2. Uncover and stir until butter and cream cheese are well combined. Cover and cook on high heat for an additional 15 minutes.
- 3. Serve immediately.

ors are not as bright as the previous shirt. At least this is how it appears to me. Maybe the previous shirt had more or brighter blue images. It does look a lot different than the original shirt but you will like it just the same.
