Anniversary Pins By: Mike Bailey

This month I will be distributing the Anniversary Pins for all UMC members who will be celebrating a 3rd, 5th, 10th,

15th, or Lifetime Member status which includes 20 continuous years or more as a member of the Utah Miata Club. This program has been going on since 2015 and initially was designed to last 5 years. In 2020 the club decided to keep doing and paying for this program by popular demand. As far as I know, no other Miata club in the country has Anniversary pins that they give to their club members. At a couple Regional Miata events, the last one I attended last year for Explore Oregon, I was wearing a hat of mine with my Lifetime Anniversary pin on it, and someone asked if they could buy one from me to put in their pin collection. I told them "no" as it was not for sale and that we did not trade these pins either. They have been good conversation piece with out-of-state club members. Our first set of pins we had a 20 and 25 year pin, but changed it to a 'Lifetime Member' pin at 20 years, thus eliminating those two pins and having one pin after 20 years membership. On our 2nd order of these



Anniversary Pins, I projected how many we would need for the next 5 years based on our Membership Roster that Jim keeps from the 2021 year, which incidentally was the 30th Anniversary of the Utah Miata Club.

If your club anniversary is in any month of this year, you will be eligible to receive that year pin starting this month. We changed the rule on receiving the pin from the month you actually became a member, to eligibility in January of your eligible year. I have a list of those



who will be eligible this year for an Anniversary Pin. There are 98 members who are eligible for pins, and an additional 6 non-active members for a total of 104 pins. Some have already received pins who were qualified last year in 2022 for their pin. There are too many to name all the members here but this is a breakdown of pins for each available year: 3 Year Pin: 7. 5 Year Pin: 29. 10 Year Pin: 20. 15 Year Pin: 12. Life Time Pin: 20 and Non-Active member pins: 6. Lifetime members are as follows: Baileys, Bowers, Carlson, Fergusons, Annie Kloer, McDonalds, Millgates, Annette Nielsen, Porters, Steckler, Tobiason, and Spence Wood. It is my hope that everyone in the club will be inspired to become a lifetime member.




I've been married twice. My first wife of 30 years (Carolyn Bohman of Morgan, Utah) passed away

Remember When by Mike Bailey

I did this series of monthly articles for the newsletter a few years back and thought it would be good to bring it back for this year. Reason being, it is more for the long time members than probably the new club members as a lot of us 'older Miata folks' like the memories to look back on and reminisce, and for new members it should be fun to read what this club has been doing for going on now for 33 consecutive years. I'll be talking about some of our trips, Miata events and cruises and other regional or national events we've participated in as well as some fun things that club members have done, as well as different activities we have had!

Question? Why does the UMC have two Logos? History of the Miata and Utah Miata Club Logo:

This will be my subject for this month, however I will only touch a little on Miata history and only have an introduction of it in this article. More to follow next month and in future newsletters.

Back in 1997 when I joined the club, the Utah Miata Club had lunches every month at Marie Calendar's Restaurant across from

St. Mark's Hospital on 3900 South. I met all the members and liked them immediately so I was hooked on joining this club. There was another Miata club in American Fork, (I forgot their name) but they were not too active and soon dissolved. At this time the club used the same logo as the "Miata Club of America" which was a round blue circle with club name and *"Miata"* logotype script in the center, similar to our Official logo now. The national club was very active back then and I also joined the national club which was run by a lady named Barbara Beach. They also had a month magazine which was very interesting. I also participated in some of their activities, which were held in California because this is where the 'Mazda North American' headquarters is located at. Lynn and I drove the Miata to California and participated in events like 'Miata Fest' and Miata racing at the Miata Laguna Seca Motorway as well as at events at MNAO (Mazda North American Offices). There we met Tom Matano and



Bob Hall, who were the original designers of the Miata. I IIII met Bob Retzer in 2002, photographer of Miata Magazine, whom I bought his 2002 Blazing Yellow from in 2003. At MNAO they displayed clay models as well as early proto-type versions of the Miata. I loved seeing those cars and learning about Miata history! More information about this and Mazda Fest events in future





Remember When' articles. I hope everyone finds this history fascinating!

Since I was in the graphics design and printing business, I got permission from the club President and officers to design a logo for the club. I researched club logos from across the country. I came up with a couple designs; one was the Star Design, with a bright yellow star and a red Miata on it, an NA like the new

1997 that I just leased, and put 'Utah Miata Club' under the car. The other design was the 'Official Logo' which we still have to this day. The club voted on the Official Logo. Through my research on other club logos, I also wanted one that was more colorful and



represented the state of Utah, so I came up with the "Mountains Logo" a month later, and when I showed it to everyone, they loved that and wanted that one also. This is why we have two logos! The first Mountains Logo was the one featured here with the black sky background. I changed it to blue after 6 months which was more popular, and hey, everyone likes a Blue Sky! Through the years, we



have changed the Miata on our logo from an NA to an NB, NC and now an ND. So members can choose which one they like best for their own personal Car Club Magnets, or even get a set of each!













