This is a company that specializes is building Cobra replications. They are famous for the Stainless Steel, aluminum bodied or 'Chrome' looking Cobra. They will custom make any kind of cobra that you want and they are all high performance vehicles. They specialize in the 427's and 289's. *You can have one for just under \$100,000.00.* They have built over 800 replica cobras since 1994. We went to visit their company 10 years ago, in March 2008. We decided that it has been awhile since we did this activity and we have lots of new members since then who have not been there, so thought it would be fun to go again. It is an interesting story on how they got in the business of doing this and when they get their aluminum sheet metal pieces from that they fabricate and build these cobras with. This will be explained when we visit them. They also build custom classic cars like their Copper 1940 Ford replica. We plan to be at Kirkham's around noon or before. The tour will take about an hour or less. We hope to have a good crowd of members participate in this.

Directions for route we will take: We will line up in the parking lot and go to 2700 West in Riverton and head south to Bangerter Highway (approx. 13800 So.) We will take Bangerter eastbound to I-15 and head south on I-15 and exit at the 1600 No. Provo exit by the Timpanogos Harley Davidson store and go west to Geneva Road. From there we will head south to 1680 North and go left (or east) to Kirkham's.



The Porters also owned one back in the day as well as several others that have been in the Utah Club. **This Miata has only 125 original actual miles on it.** Yes! 125 Miles! Everything in it is stock and has the 1.8 liter engine with a 5-speed manual transmission. It was the last year of the NA or First Generation Miata production. It was the only special edition Miata for that year. It has the tan leather interior. It also has the original factory Hard Top with stand, installation kit, mud guards, original key and pen gift set that came with it from the factory for the 'M' Edition. Also included is the owners manual and MSRP window sticker and much, much more. Everything is still in original wrappers.


Taking your Miata on a cruise...

This Miata adventure explores western Canada via Mount Rainer National Park in the state of Washington. The United States will be left via ferry from Port Angeles, Washington, to Victoria, British Columbia. The adventure will continue to the northern end of Vancouver Island to Port Hardy, British Columbia. A second ferry ride of 318 miles will begin from Port Hardy through the inside passage to Prince Rupert, British Columbia. From Prince Rupert, the adventure will wind its way back to the United States at Grand Forks, British Columbia, at the Washington State border. Total estimated driving miles: 3,276 Total ferryboat miles: 340 This trip does require a current passport.

Travel Dates: June 22nd through July 4th, 2018

New Miata Club Shirt Idea?

I'd like to make a club shirt similar in design to the popular Hawaiian Miata Shirt that Tom Thompson from the San Diego Miata Club designed and came out with. This would be particular to our Utah Club and could feature our cars or logos, Utah features, etc. I have an associate I work with in my business who is involved in making these kind of shirts particularly for sports teams and other groups, clubs, or organizations. The shirt can be designed anyway one wishes it to be and can be printed using a dyesublimation process that prints the entire area of the shirt. It works best on a 100% white polyester material, such as I have been doing on Polos or T-Shirts for many of the Utah Club event shirts the past couple years. I think more members prefer the polo style shirt. A Polo style shirt actually works the best and is easier to make than a button up shirt, but we could do either. We need to come up with a design with photos, illustrations or logos. The images can repeat over the entire shirt like the Miata Hawaiian shirt. Another photo with this article is the shirt that you have seen Chuck and Diane Graham, our San Diego members have worn to the luncheons.

Please let me know your ideas on this and we can discuss it at our meetings and come up with something. The cost is relatively low on producing it and it would sell for about \$50.00 each and can be made in





men's and ladies sizes. We could also probably sell it nationally to other clubs or miata groups as a fundraiser for our club or if there is not interest in our club doing that, then I would probably promote it myself and take all the risk. Mainly, I would be interested in seeing how many of our club members would be interested in purchasing one. If you are interested in getting one, please let me know.
