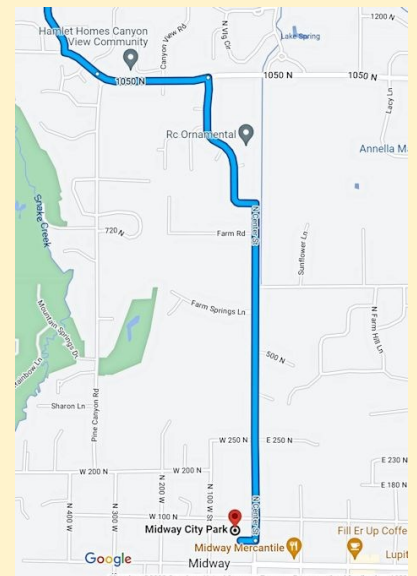
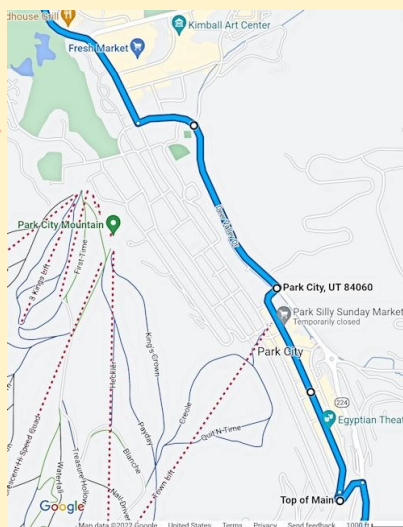
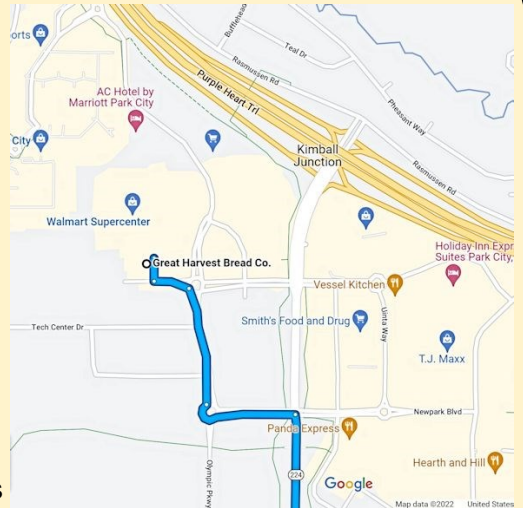

## April Lunch Meeting and Drive Report By: Valerie Francis



What better way to welcome April than to get together for our monthly lunch meeting and drive. About 25 cars showed up for the meeting at the pavilion reserved just for our group. Thanks to Hank Pond for helping Susan and Mark Vaughn with this. (PS: we will be at the same location for our summer picnic in July). At the meeting we covered normal topics but two new ones included; elections are coming up in a couple of months so we need those members so inclined to throw your name in the hat to be nominated for a position, and that the plan is coming together for a fall leaf drive to Bryce and Capitol Reef (see details in the article in this news letter and on our website).



After lunch, Mark led 18 cars south to Saratoga Springs, and after a quick bathroom stop, we headed west to Rush Valley and up over "Johnson Pass".

Interesting side notes on the name of the pass: "Johnson's Pass finally took its name sometime after 1858 after one of Clover's first settlers. Luke S. Johnson came to the area in 1856 and eventually founded the town of Clover."

"Later, Lincoln Highway promoter Carl G. Fisher funded the project to build the road over Johnson's Pass, which was greatly unimproved at that time. In return for financing the project, the state promised to rename the pass in honor of Carl Fisher, which would have changed the name to "Fisher's Pass." At present there is a monument to Fisher on the summit of the pass along with an example of a Lincoln Highway road marker. Most people, however, still refer to the road over the mountains as "Johnson's Pass."

"One last note about the Lincoln Highway and the pass: In 1919, a young lieutenant crossed it with his military truck convoy — the first to ever prove the concept of a coast to coast highway. That lieutenant's name was Dwight David Eisenhower. He stayed

overnight at Orr's Ranch after passing through Johnson's Pass and having a horrible time in the sand dunes west of Willow Springs."



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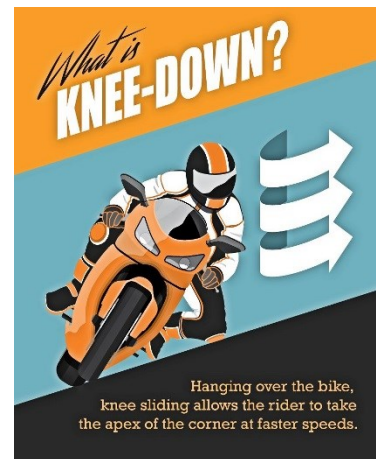
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"Beware of the time of day you choose to visit Johnson's Pass. The "Dugway 500" takes place every weekday morning and night (Monday-Thursday) as hundreds of cars speed over the pass toward Dugway. Some of these folks could probably be seasoned, professional NASCAR drivers. Sharing the road with them can be a trying experience."

Now back to our drive - After swerving through all the fun canyon twisties we stopped at the large pull out at the summit to catch our breath. It was scary exciting to see his knee almost touch the road on the turn where we could see him. He also stopped to take photos of our cars at the summit.



We had to time our exit back onto the road as to not interfere with the racing motorcycle, then headed down the twisties on the other side of the canyon. Once out of the canyon it was a straight road to the pull-out at Dugway, where we stopped to say goodbye. From here several Miatas headed home north on Hwy 196 then east on I-80, and the rest went back over Johnson Pass, then home.

Even though the canyon is short, the twisties are so worth the drive there, especially because on weekends there is hardly any traffic and we can go as fast as we want.

Someone asked me at the last Club Meeting how the cleaned plastic covers on the headlight have progressed.

OK! So here is the original article:

The process requires "MOTHERS MAG & ALUMINUM POLISH".

YGROWUP had already been wrapped up for the winter so I tried it on my Xterra. The plastic covering on the headlight was sooo cloudy that you could not see the lamp inside. I used an old toothbrush to spread the polish around and around and around....you get the pix. I then used a microfiber cloth to remove the goo that was on the headlight covering.



WOW!! You could now see the lamp and reflector inside the housing. I have no idea how long this will last, but it is now on my winter driving vehicle and I will report its condition. (Sorry, I should have taken a pix of the lense prior to doing the procedure.)

Here is the follow-up answer to the question: All I did was spray some window cleaner on a paper towel and wiped the bugs off. This is how it looks today. I hope you can see that the lens is still very clear. For such little effort I am extremely please with the outcome. There seems to be some staining on the inside of the plastic lens, but I can still see the reflector and bulb very clearly. Hope that answers any questions.

# The Incomparable Bryce Canyon / Capitol Reef Fall Leaf Drive

**It's On!** The plan is coming together for a fun and beautiful drive to Bryce Canyon and Torrey / Capitol Reef National Parks. We are still finalizing some of the lunch plans so this is a heads up so you can put this on your calendar and reserve your hotel rooms.

**Friday Sept 23:** SLC to Bryce via Mt Nebo Loop (weather permitting) down Hwy 89, over Gooseberry Road past Fish Lake to Bryce. A group dinner at Ruby's Inn is being planned but you can also find dinner on your own. Depending on arrival time you can explore the park on your own too.

**Saturday Sept 24:** After a couple hours on a group ride through Bryce or free time to explore/hike Bryce, we head to Torrey / Capital Reef via All-American Scenic Byway 12 through Escalante, Hogs Back, (possible side trip down the Burr Trail), and over Boulder Mountain to Torrey. As in the past, we are in the planning stage for an early group dinner in Torrey then an early evening / sunset drive through Capitol Reef.

**Sunday Sept 25<sup>th</sup>:** we head home via Hwy 72 and Hwy 10, to Ferron, up Huntington Canyon and down Fairview Canyon, then home via Hwy 89 Spanish Fork or Nephi. Still working on possible lunch plans for this day.

If you have been on this trip before you know how great the roads and scenery are. Below is the information on discount rates available at Ruby's Inn in Bryce. Mike Bailey worked his magic and got us a nice discount off listed rates. Only 20 rooms are being held so reserve as soon as possible

**Friday 9/23** Best Western Ruby's Inn discount information and link for booking at the discount:

**The rooms will be QQ (Double Queen) in the outlying buildings by the main lodge for \$200.00 + 13.87% sales tax for one night, September 23, 2022, for 2 people.** A 3rd or 4th person can stay in one of these rooms for an additional \$10.00 per person charge. Some have a lake view and others may not. We cannot specify which building at this time when reserving the room. **We have a block of 20 rooms set aside for our group, on a first come, first served basis.** Check out is 11:00 a.m. A full breakfast is included in cost of room. (Reg. \$13.50).

**Note: Cancellation Policy:** There is a 48 hr. cancellation before arrival date if anyone needs to cancel for any reason. If you do not want to stay at Ruby's Inn, there are other small motels on the main road by Bryce Canyon City that you are welcome to check out.

**Meals:** A dinner is planned for Friday evening at the Ruby's Cowboy Buffet and Steak Room. Mike does not have the time reserved yet, but we will know prior our trip. We can order off the menu, either a specific meal available or the dinner buffet. The price is the same as it was on our 2020 trip at \$23.25 each person. You may choose to eat with the group or not. The conference rooms are currently booked but Mike is trying to get a room or private section of the restaurant for our group. See menu on UMC website.

**Box Lunches for Saturday:** Box Lunches are available to purchase for \$12.50 each. A form will be passed out at meetings that has to be filled out and sent to Ruby's Canyon Diner at least 5 days before our arrival in Bryce for them to prepare these meals. We may collect these forms and send in as a group. We will pick up the box lunches after we finish our Saturday morning drive to Bryce Canyon before we head out to travel to Torrey, the same as we did on our 2020 trip.

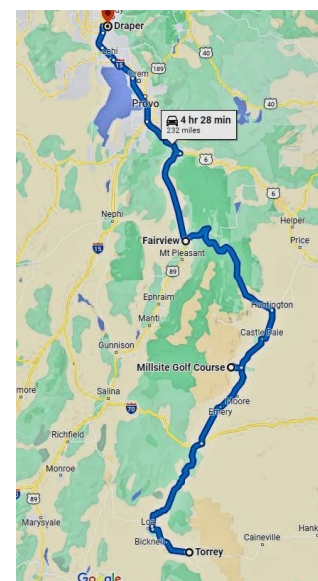
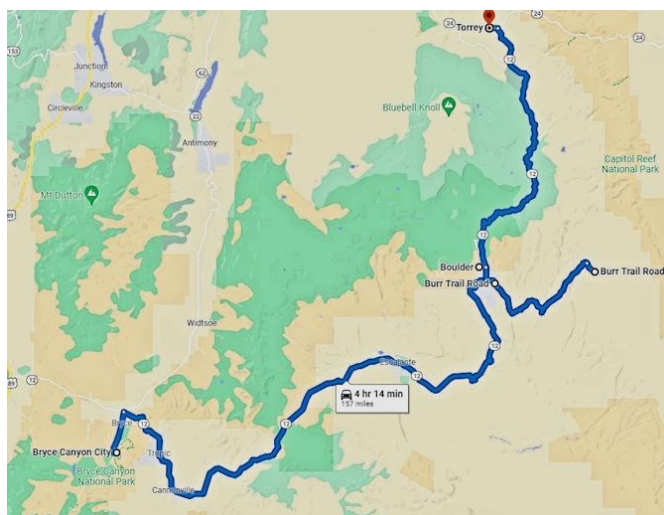
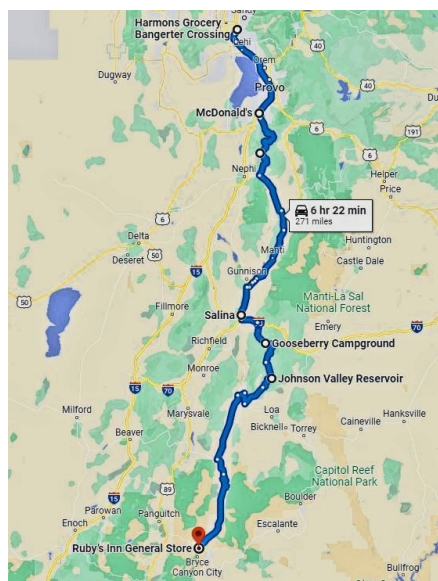




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Saturday 9/24: your choice of several hotels in Torrey (some have already reserved rooms at Broken Spur Inn). A group dinner is still being worked on.

Please let me know if you want one of these and your size as they can be ordered through me.

We also have other T or Sweatshirts with either the Long Live the Roadster logo, or the Official or Mountains logo on them. Sweatshirts run around \$32.-\$42. depending on the style (Pullover Hoodie, Crew Neck, 1/4 Zip, or Full Zip with Hoodie). We can also print the "Miata" script type on the sleeve. T-shirts can be short or long sleeve.



Denim Shirts are popular as well usually with the Official Logo on them. They come in short or long sleeve. Polo Shirts are either printed or embroidered with logo and they are \$35.00. 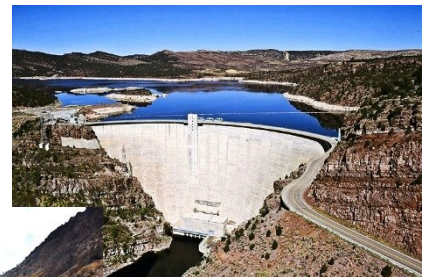


## Information on Upcoming Trips Available Online By: Valerie Francis

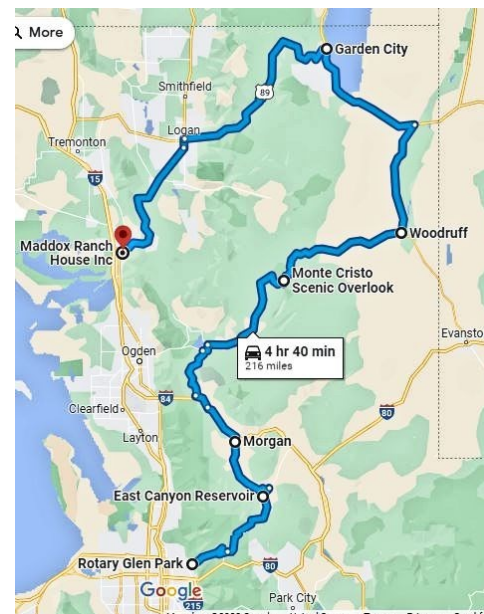
