





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Miata Tales by Ken Jaworski

Once upon a time there was a 2001 Miata Special Edition named **YGROWUP** that had 149,000 miles on the odometer. While her name suggested nothing could go wrong by staying young.....there was a disaster just waiting to happen.

OKAY so much for fairy tales. When this light comes on or lights up on your dash, be warned something serious is about to happen.



We were headed out for a 7-day trip to Lake Powell, Page, Flagstaff, Sedona, Lake Mead, Mesquite, St. George, Cedar City, Delta, Tooele, and back home to Park City. Well, we got to Page, AZ when this pesky little light came on. I headed for the O"Reilly's that we passed when we went to dinner. They put their tester on the battery (underneath a well overly packed trunk) and said battery, alternator, and starter were in fine shape. That light was not on when they did their test, but it came on again when we headed to the motel.

Let's get something straight right now! Have you ever told your sweetheart of 55 years of marriage that your vacation has just ended before it even began. Just think about it!!

The next morning we were headed back to Park City. Ohhhh! The light was not on....did I make a mistake!! False Alarm.....NOT!! It came on and stayed on. We got about 20 miles north of Panguitch, Utah when all hell broke lose. From 65 mph to zero in a matter of 300 yards thru an intersection of Hwy 89 and Hwy 20 to a layby across the highway from a Sinclair gas station and quick shop. All the gauges stopped working including the tachometer while we jerked to a halt. Needless to say we ended up in Park City on a flatbed trailer at 11:00PM. (courtesy of Jeff Durrant).

The next day I was on YouTube diagnosing my situation. There are many and I mean many video's to watch including Miata's. Out comes the VOM and I started to test the battery (in a now empty trunk). The voltage was less than 12.0 vdc with the engine running. Now the DIY kicks in. Yup, the alternator is on the right side of the engine under all that plastic piping from the air filter to the intake manifold (see the white circled area of the engine compartment left pix). On a closer examination you can actually see it (see the white circle on the right pix).

The one check besides the voltage would be to see if the auxiliary belt is tight and turning the alternator when the



engine is running. It was! I'm not going to go thru the complete replacement procedure because YouTube does a good job of that. BUT, I will give you a final warning about the installation. When you put on the battery cable to the alternator make sure you have the wires going straight up towards the engine block. Why might you ask? Because the stabilizing bracket that goes to the inlet manifold is directly behind the alternator and you will have to completely remove the alternator to reposition those wires. Don't ask why I know??



The arrow on this pix shows the direction required of the wires to prevent being blocked by the stabilizing bracket (red rectangle) directly behind and I do mean directly behind the alternator.



The old expression of "if it ain't broke, don't touch it" might not apply to a Miata with 149,000 miles on the odometer. Yes, the timing belt was replaced at 100,000 miles because the Owner's Manual said so.

Moral of this story is______, you fill in the blanks. I'm still in the dog house!

other 50+ Miatas) took a Sunset drive over Colorado National Monument. I don't know which was more beautiful; the canyon or the line of Miatas.



Northwest 'Ghosts & Legends' September Trip by Gordy Nicholl

Let's do a Ghost and Legends Loop through the Northwest corner of Utah (Box Elder County). Just after the Labor Day weekend and after the summer's heat.

September 6th & 7th, that's Wednesday and Thursday, with an overnight stay in West Wendover. on the 6th, most likely at the Montego Bay Hotel. Details to follow later on booking hotel.

Let's meet for Lunch (TBD - SLC) at 11:30 am. After lunch ~ 1:00 pm we'll pick up the itinerary as follows: **Note: There will be some dirt roads.**

September 6th:

From Lunch, we'll head West to Garfield Utah - Ghost Town

Option 1 Via UT201 West to UT202 Northwest over I-80 to the stop sign ~19 miles 20 miles.

Option 2 Via I-80 West to Exit 104 - West to the stop sign ~19 miles 20 miles.

The Garfield & Black Rock Beach Monuments are on the south side of the intersection. From the Garfield stop sign - take Saltair Drive - North - 2.3 miles to the Old Saltair Site, Back to I-80 interchange Exit 104 - 2.3 miles.

Then West on I-80 - To Delle Utah - Ghost Town - 35 miles 31 minutes.

Then West on I-80 - To West Wendover - 72 miles 61 minutes.

Overnight (Sep 6th) West Wendover (Check In - Gas up Miatas - R&R - Dinner, Party).

Sep 6th totals ~123 miles 1 Hr. 50 min drive time + stops.

September 7th: After breakfast - departure time 9:00 am. It's going to be a long day - bring snacks and drinks.

Head West on I-80 - To Oasis Nevada - 32 miles 30 minutes.

Then Northeast on NV 233 - To Montello Nevada (rest stop/gas) - 23 Miles 20 min.

Continue Northeast on NV 223 then UT 30 - To the Lucin turn off - 19 miles 20 min.

Turn Right/South at the Lucin turn off - dirt road - 5.7 miles 15 minutes.

Arrive - Lucin Ghost Town - back to UT 30 - 5.7 miles 15 minutes.

Cross UT 30 - continue North - dirt road - to Grouse Creek - 30 miles 40 minutes.

Grouse Creek (rest stop/gas) not a Ghost Town but a Legend - just need to see it.

Return to UT 30 from Grouse Creek - 30 miles 40 minutes.

East on UT 30 - To Rosette - Ghost Town - 51 miles 60 minutes.

Continue East on UT 30 - To Park Valley - Ghost Town - 4 miles 4 minutes.

From Park Valley turn south - **Russian Cemetery/Ghost Town** - dirt road - 7.21 miles 15 minutes.

Russian Cemetery - Return to Park Valley - 7.21 miles 15 minutes.

Continue East on UT 30 - To Kelton turnoff - 10 miles 10 minutes.

At Kelton Road turn south to - Kelton Ghost Town - dirt road - 7 miles 15 minutes.

From Kelton - Return to UT 30 - 7 miles 15 minutes.

Snowville - rest stop - late lunch- gas.

Note: From West Wendover (with sites) to Snowville - 223 miles 4 hrs 8 min + stops.

I-84/I-15 South - To Salt Lake City/Home 108 miles 80 minutes.

Sep 7th totals ~351 miles 6 Hr. 12 min drive time. We'll need to gas up at least once.

Total Loop 474 miles 8 hrs 10 min drive time + stops.

That's 9 Ghost Towns & 1 Legend!



Remember When: Miatas In Utah Events by Mike Bailey

This month for my 'Remember When' article (we didn't have one last month due to me being sick more days than usual and needing help from Val on the NL) I thought of writing about some of our more memorable car club events, namely our 'Miatas in Utah' events that we have put on since 2003. We started calling them Miatas in Utah events since 2014 when we put on 'Miatas in Bryce' (Canyon), a different venue. Before that we called these events 'Miatas in Moab' as this is where we started holding the events. We have done Miatas in Moab every 2 years beginning in 2003 and have put on 5 Moab events, with a 6th Moab event planned in 2020 which we had to cancel because of the Covid-19 Pandemic. This event sold out within one month and we had to return all the money for the event registrations to those who had signed up. We didn't have an event in 2018 because we just did a major event in the fall of 2017 called the 'Viking River Cruise' to Europe (Amsterdam Netherlands to Budapest Hungary) which lasted about 20 days. We had 86 Miata people from across the country come to that! (mentioned in the May 2023 Remember When article).

Our 2010 and 2012 events in Moab brought 285 Miatas and 350 Miatas respectively, which translated into about 550 and 600 people respectively, a whole lot of Miata enthusiasts. We had to limit the amount of people coming to Miatas in Bryce (2014) and Miatas at Deer Valley (2016) and further made a limitation on the 2020 event. At Moab IV we had Chris Hill and a couple Mazda videographers from Mazda North American Operations (MNAO) come .They were simply amazed at the number of Miatas there at that beautiful venue. They videotaped our events for a couple days and sent us a movie of it. It was called "Miata Roadflix". It's no longer available online now.

We have made life-long friends, and have had hundreds of Miata people in other clubs across the country and Canada, and some from Europe attend our events. We are still good friends today with these people. Many keep asking me when we will do another Moab event as they enjoyed it so much. Our national events have been limited the past few years, both going to and attending them. Last one we went to was Explore Oregon in 2022. Also we've done many international cruises and to Caribbean and Alaska. We did Fall for New England for 10 days in 2019. I would love to do another Moab event but we'll have to see what the future brings for that! Right now it is not in the works because of all the hard work and people involved to put an event like this on. Photos on next page taken at different Miatas in Utah events. 


October 2023 Annular Eclipse By: Mike Bailey / Roger Heath
