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From the Top Down “Oh, the Places We’ll Go!”

Hooray for May and great top-down driving weather! And what better way to enjoy this weather than going on a drive out to Antelope Island State Park. See the details of this month's lunch meeting and drive on page 2. In the meantime, here are some fun facts about Antelope Island:

It is the largest of the ten islands in the Great Salt Lake, measuring fifteen miles long and seven miles across, and lies entirely within Davis County. It consists of over 28,000 acres of low mountains, grasslands, marshes, and sand dunes, with the Frary peak reaching an elevation of 6,596 feet, which is about 2,500 feet above the level of the lake (4200ft).

Antelope Island has 40 major freshwater springs found primarily on the East side, producing 36 million gallons of water each year.

Prehistoric people inhabited the island over 6,000 years ago, including Shoshone and Goshute Indians. The first known non-Native American exploration of Antelope Island was in 1845 by John C. Fremont and Kit Carson. Three years after the Fremont Expedition, in 1848, Fielding Garr established the first permanent residence on Antelope Island. The Fielding Garr ranch still stands on Antelope Island and is Utah's oldest Anglo-built structure still standing on its existing foundation.

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American Bison were introduced to the island in 1893 and roam wild. They have since grown to a herd fluctuating between 550 and 700, making it one of the largest publicly owned bison herds in the nation.

The metamorphic and igneous rocks on Antelope Island are some of the oldest in the nation, even older than those found at the bottom of the Grand Canyon.

After adult brine flies hatch, their casings often pile up along the shoreline of the Great Salt Lake. One year, the Utah Division of Wildlife Resources counted seven billion cases along the Antelope Island Causeway. That's more brine fly casings than there are people on earth! With an abundance of delicious brine shrimp, over 250 types of migrating and nesting birds can be seen on antelope Island.

With the beautiful scenery of bison, antelope, grasslands, Wasatch Mountains, and the sky, who wouldn't want to drive top-down to experience this special place in Utah? Oh the places we'll go Zoom Zooming!

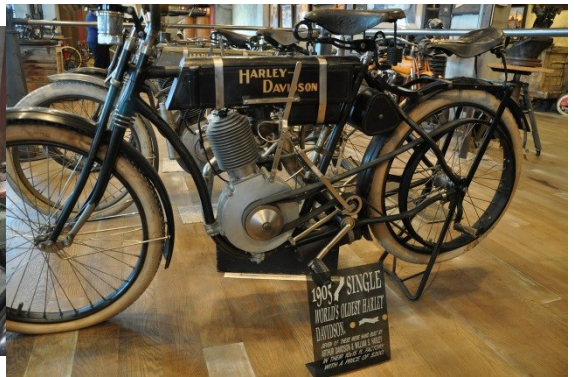

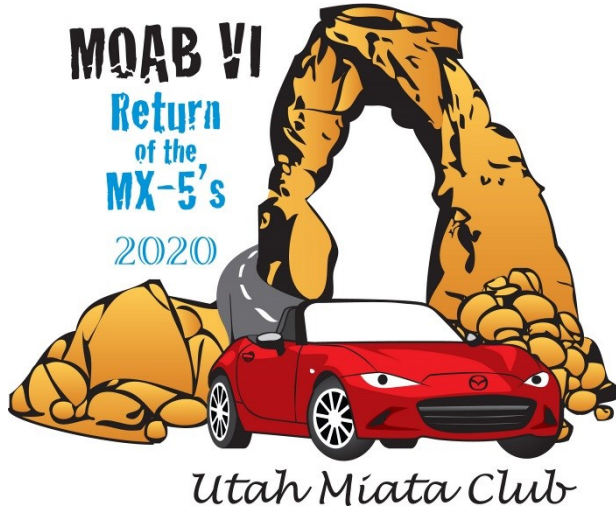
