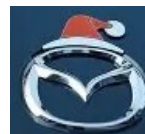

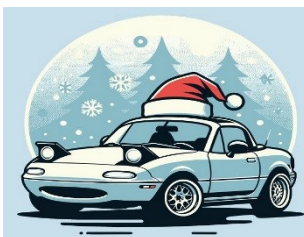
The party will also feature the annual white-elephant gift exchange. One gift per person.

White Elephant Gift Exchange Rules by Steve Beckstead

Yankee Swap Game Rules:

To avoid confusion this is the White Elephant gift exchange information:

Gifts should not be too expensive, about \$25 tops. Clever and funny gifts are popular! All Participants who bring a gift will be given a slot in the "Yankee Swap". If a couple wishes to play as one, that's fine, they just get one pick.

1. Arrange chairs in a circle and move all the gifts to center of the circle.
2. Host will send groups to the gift pile to select a gift and return to their seat.
3. When instructed, everyone OPENS their gift, places it on floor in front of their chair, for all to see.
4. Host will go around and everyone will "Show & Tell" what they picked. He will try to be quick, but please LISTEN; this is your chance to really see what's there.
5. Time for the "Yankee Swap" (Gifts stay in plain view in front of each person).
 - A. Host will pull a ticket from the basket and call the number
 - B. That person may keep their gift **OR** swap their gift with **ANY OTHER GIFT** (**Each gift may only be swapped twice to keep things moving**).
 1. The player has 1 minute to make the swap. Tickets are called once.
 2. This round is over. The person whose gift was taken does NOT "re-swap" and keeps the gift they were given.
 3. Host calls the next number. (Repeated until all tickets drawn).
6. Once all the tickets have been drawn, the "Yankee Swap" is over, and you keep the gift you have! Yes—those that have their ticket drawn last will have an advantage for the best pick, but we all had an equal chance of a later pick.

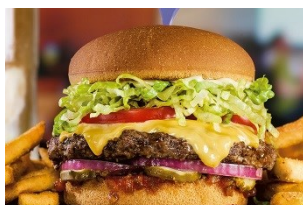
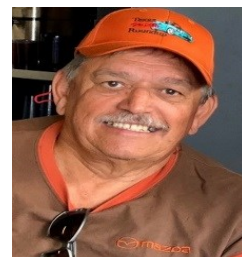
January Luncheon & Activity by Mike Bailey

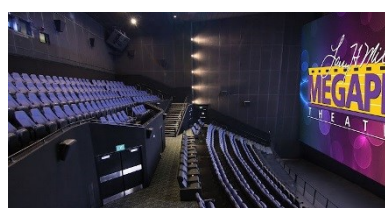

Utah Miata Club Helpful Hints for Drive Leaders / Sweeps / Participants

Drive Leaders:

Have a drivers meeting before starting the drive and review:

The route, general directions, and stops along the route.

Remind everyone to turn on FRS radios and channel used

(5.5).

If someone does not have a radio, place them towards the front of the group.

Invite or elect a sweep car (Miata that will be last car on the drive). Usually a sweep will also pull out onto the road and hold OTM traffic back until our group pulls out.

If there are lots of cars (over 10), we will have a person in the middle (with a radio) to pass information back to rest of the group.

It is important that everyone pulls out at the SAME time when leader instructs group to pull out. This saves the group a lot of time and confusion when pulling out from a standing stop.

When planning the route incorporate right hand turns instead of left hand turns whenever possible.

If possible, pre-test your drive for timing and road conditions. (Can also use Google Maps to calculate drive times and road conditions.)

When planning the route (or during the drive) look for safe areas to regroup in case the group gets separated.

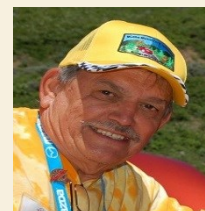
If you need to pull over to regroup make sure the pull off area will accommodate the entire group.

When reentering the road from a pull out, wait for Sweep to confirm that it is safe to pull out. (See note above about the group pulling out at the same time).

For longer drives, plan a pit stop about every 1 ½ - 2 hours, especially during the first leg of the drive.

Alternately, via radio, call out upcoming pit stop areas and request feedback if anyone needs to stop.

Call out items that may impact the group; rocks or any obstructions in the road, or cattle, bicyclists and people on the edge of the road such as runners, etc.



Drive Sweep:

Inform the Drive Leader if the group gets separated.

If the group has pulled over to regroup, inform everyone when it is clear for the entire group to pull back onto the road.

The Sweep car pulls out first when pulling back onto the road, with everyone else pulling out at the same time.

All drive Participants:

Arrive with a full tank of gas especially for longer drives.

Bring a FRS radio. Set radio to Channel 5.5.

Listen for directions, warnings, possible stops.

Notify Drive Leader if you are leaving the drive early.

Pull out as a group when the Sweep confirms it is safe to pull out from a regrouping stop.

Utilize double left hand turn lanes to help ensue all cars get through a green left hand turn light, then merge back into a single lane. On all longer drives we will generally have several rest stops along the way and usually a place to have lunch or snacks if the drive is a longer drive.

If anyone needs to return home early or leave early, please let the drive leader know this or mention it at one of the breaks along the road. Be sure to **HAVE FUN** and to **BE SAFE!**

Newsworthy Items from UMC Members



Helpful Hints for the care of your MX-5 Miata

Now that your Miata is stored for the winter months, here are a couple of tips to keep it tip top and ready to roll in the spring:

AGM Battery Maintenance

The early and some later models of Miatas have an Absorption Glass Mat, (AGM) battery in the trunk or under the hood. This is a sealed battery, not to be confused with the standard, vented, wet cell batteries found on most other vehicles. In order to keep it fully charged during the winter months, it is recommended that you put a battery tender charger on the battery, and charge or maintain it using no more than 2 amps. Any higher amperage and that will cook the AGM battery. No need to worry about off gassing as there is no vent tube on the AGM battery. It's good practice to check your battery condition several times a year.

Tire Maintenance and particularly your spare tire (if you have one)

When was the last time you checked your spare tire for proper tire pressure. I know the newer model Miata's don't carry a spare, but the earlier models have one in the trunk. The spare is smaller than your stock tire, so it requires higher tire pressure, to hold the weight of the car in an emergency. The recommended tire pressure is 65 psi. Now is a good time to check it, but especially just before going on a several day road trip or a long drive. Check your tire pressure and tires regularly for any nails, damage, incorrect wear or anything that may detect any issue. You don't want to be on a road trip and have a tire problem .

Miata Tips by Gordy Nicholl

1. After your Miata has been parked in the garage for a length of time, be sure to check the air level in all four tires before driving. Check the oil level as well as other fluids (brake, power steering, window washer fluid, etc.) Also it is a good idea to put some fuel 'stabilizer' in your gas tank when storing vehicle for the winter.
2. Put a couple ounces of Injector Cleaner in the gas tank every couple of months and you will be cleaning the injectors and increasing your engine's performance. It will also improve your mileage. There are several brands at the auto parts stores to choose from.
3. How often do you need to charge the battery when your car sits in the garage? If your car is not used regularly simply put a trickle charger on the battery for at least two days per month.
4. Key Fobs: They are expensive if you lose one. Put your name and phone number on them so if lost someone can call you if they find it.
5. Insurance Tip: Some insurance companies allow you to just keep Liability or Comprehensive insurance on your Vehicle if stored for the winter and you are not driving it.

Editor's Note: I have been doing this for years with my Miatas however this year Utah passed a law that they are not allowing this practice anymore. Check with your insurance company if they allow it.

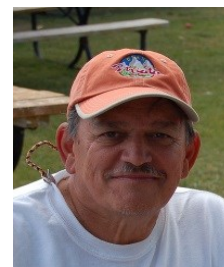

Coming up in January is the start of the new year and it means that the Utah Miata Club will start issuing Anniversary pins to those members who have earned them. For new club members this program has been going on in our club for almost ten years. Each year we award club members who have been members of the club an “Anniversary” pin for the number of consecutive years they have been members of the club. Pins are awarded after the following years: Three, Five, Ten, Fifteen and after 20 years a Lifetime Pin is awarded. These are very nice pins composed of various different metal types; ie: copper, silver, nickel, bronze, and gold. Several have a white background and others are composed of the metal alloys. The year number is on the bottom.

In the beginning we had a 20 Year Pin and a 25 Year Pin but since about 2020 we dropped those two pins and instead came up with the ‘Lifetime’ Pin. Members can choose to wear them on their clothing like a shirt or hat. Some have put them on a banner or just keep them at home with other Utah Miata Club related logo items.

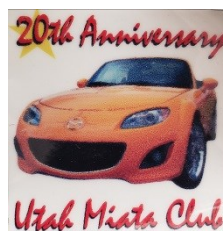
Club Membership Decals:
