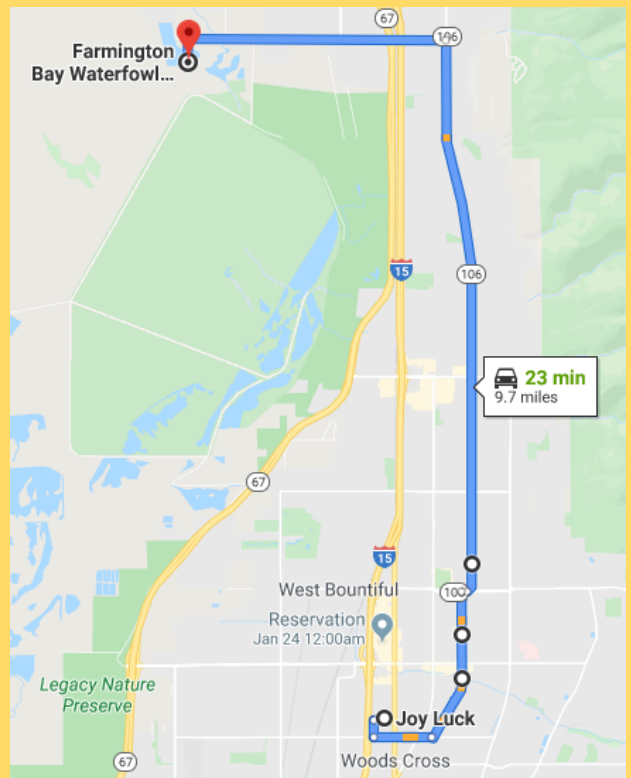
We will meet in their private room and order off their special lunch menu.

The 'new' 30th Anniversary Utah Club Decal was unveiled to those present at the January Election & Planning Meeting. To celebrate the upcoming 30th Anniversary of the Utah Miata Club I have designed a new image. It is similar to one that we have used before which has been very popular with the Utah Miata Club members. It is also similar to the event pin which we made for Miatas in Moab VI. It includes the four generations of the Miata, featuring the new 30th Anniversary Racing Orange Miata on it, front and center. The other three generation Miatas featured are a Blue NA in the center, a Yellow NB on the left hand side, and a Red NC Miata on the right hand side. It will also feature the Official Utah Club logo on the top above the image of the Delicate Arch. The arch on this logo is simple as to not detract from the Miatas. Refer to the attached picture of the decal.

If approved by the Executive Board officers, we will make up some static cling decals for every member's Miata. The size will be approximately 2.75" wide x 3.5" high. It is printed on a removable stock so can be taken on and off your window for your convenience. Most members put them either on the top or bottom of their windshield or on the wing side window. They will be similar to the 25th Anniversary decal we did 5 years ago. If you did not know this before, the club has produced a decal for the 10th, 15th, 20th, and 25th anniversary's of the club. If anyone is interested in seeing what they look like, I have all of them on both my Miatas. More details to come on this window decal.

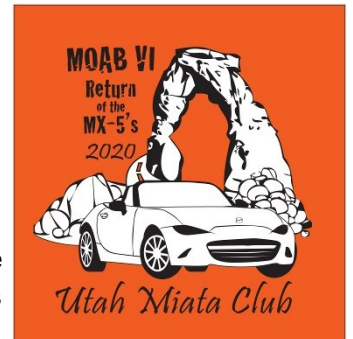


Miata in Moab VI Apparel By: Mike Bailey
