October Luncheon & Drive by Michael Thompson



The drive and the day are on the long side of normal for a Saturday event, which means an earlier than customary start. But, the day will be broken into sections, so that there is enough relaxation to keep it thoroughly enjoyable. Here are the plans as they stand...



Meetup time: The monthly business meeting will come to order at 8:30AM (so we can be on the road by 9:30AM). Location: The covered picnic area, George Wahlen Park, 4200 S 2175 W, Roy, UT 84067. There is an east entrance to the park, off 1900 W, which does not go through. You want the west entrance off 2175 W. (41.187663 N, 112.032099 W). After September 30th there is no reserved seating, so bring camp chairs just in case. We have met in that park before, so you might recall that there are restrooms nearby. However, given the time of year, it's likely they will be locked. To shorten the trip just a smidge, and avoid the challenges of keeping the group together through city traffic, we will make a short dash up I-15 to the Brigham City/Logan exit. We will transit Sardine Canyon, skirt Logan itself, and take US 91 to Preston. It's a short hop to where we will turn east on SR 36 to Montpelier. This section of the trip is over a beautiful, winding mountain road. Then it's US 30 the rest of the way to Lava. It will also be nice to see the Fall leaves through the canyons.













We will enjoy lunch /meeting at the 78 Main Street Eatery, followed by a relaxing soak in the famous hot pools of Lava Hot Springs. Entrance is \$10 for seniors (60+), \$12 for adults. Bring a swimsuit, towel and flip flops or swim shoes. There are private changing stalls. Clothing and personal effects may be kept in coin-op lockers while you relax. Once fingers are well-pruned and you are fully recovered—ready to tackle the trip home—it would be a mistake to skip town without a stop at the Sweet Stuff Ice Cream Parlor on Main Street, for excellent Farr's ice cream.

The ice cream stop is the official end of the activity. Some might want to head west out of Lava and catch I-15 for the quickest return. Finding a motel nearby might be your cuppa joe, if wanting to spend the night. We plan to drive east, then south on SR 34 back through Preston, Logan, Sardine Canyon and home. This section of the drive will be recognizable to those who went on the Beartooth trip.

Roy to Lava via Montpelier is 175 miles and 3:15. En route, Logan, Preston or Montpelier are possible rest stops. The return to Roy (to choose a theoretical end point) by way of SR 34 to Preston, Logan, etc. is 136 miles and 2:15. Total drive time is 5:30, with a relaxing break in the middle. You will need to add your distance from the Wahlen Park in Roy to calculate your miles and time. There is no shortage of gas stations along the journey. But, what do you think? Can you make the 311 mile circuit without refueling? Photos below of our groups back in 2011—2014.

As one of our favorite drives, we hope everyone that came along had as much fun as we did!














October 14, 2023 Annular Eclipse By Robert Mechling

Leaving Friday, October 13th. We will meet at the Harmon's Grocery Store parking lot in Draper, off I-15 and 138000 South (east of I-15) at 11:00 a.m. The Mechlings will be in charge. We will have lunch at Kneader's Bakery located on east side of parking lot. After lunch around 1:00 we will give driving instructions and plan to drive to Payson to go on the Mount Nebo Loop to check out the Fall Leaves. The drive will be from the north to south. We should have time to view the 'Devil's Kitchen' there. After exiting in Nephi, we will head to Salina. We are staying at the Super 8 by Wyndham Hotel in Salina. 375 E. 1620 S. Phone: 435-529-7483. Alternate Salina Hotel is Quality Inn & Suites.



We plan to check into the hotel when we arrive in Salina. Dinner will be at Mom's Café, or you are welcome to dine where you please. Be sure to pick up some snacks or a sandwich or lunch for the eclipse. Total approximate time for viewing the eclipse is about 3 hours. A discussion to plan viewing the eclipse on Saturday morning will be discussed on Friday after arriving in Salina with all participants. There are currently 3 options: 1). View eclipse in Salina. 2). View eclipse in Richfield. 3). Drive to Monroe, south of Richfield. If going to Richfield or Monroe we will head out by early in the morning to have plenty of time to get to destination and set up our chairs, etc.

Details will be explained by Robert about the eclipse, such as starting and ending time and duration of the eclipse. The full annular eclipse of the sun will be 89.44% obscured. <u>Important: Bring your camp chairs to set up to watch the eclipse. Bring your safe solar viewing glasses (eclipse glasses). Do not view the eclipse without proper eyewear to prevent eye damage!</u>

After the eclipse we will head back home. You are welcome to spend more time in and around this area if you wish.






one for \$20.00. (\$22.00 for size 2XL). They print best on an Ash, or light Grey, but if you'd like any light color shirt, that's ok.

Hello friends old and new:

We wanted to reach out as we have been absent the Miata car seen as of late. July for us was consumed with family visitation and a road trip to Yellowstone National Park with the Utah Miata Club to include the Grand Tetons, the Beartooth Hwy reaching 11,000 feet in elevation and a breakaway on our own for a four day stay at Big Sky Lake near Seely Montana with fellow club members Patti Chamberlain and Dave Kempton. Huckleberry gathering was a favorite activity as well as long walkabouts. The journey thus far so good. Great scenery, great people.

Time came to head home with plans on being home in time to participate with the Miata Club in the All American Car Show. Home late Friday with plans on showing up for the car show bug splattered and with all the tales of our three thousand mile journey. Once back in Utah and Nevada the temperatures grew unbelievably hot. It was 112 to 118 with road surface temperature melting the Hwy. The speed limit was 80 MPH and the car held strong on engine temperature while cooling, air conditioner pumping away. We reached Henderson Nevada about two in the afternoon. The road we were on was pretty new and it was hot at 118 degrees. No shade no trees. The street was two lanes wide each way and the speed limit was 25 mph.
